A Word from Our President



Have you ever experienced a "dry spell" in your walk with God, where it was difficult to read His Word or even pray? A time when you just did not understand what God was doing in your life? Maybe a time when you felt completely abandoned by God, even though you felt you were in the middle of God's will for your life?

This is something that will happen to every single Christian who wants to be involved in the work of

God, or to any Christian who has truly set his or her heart on pleasing God. "Who among you fears the Lord? Who obeys the voice of His Servant? Who walks in darkness And has no light? Let him trust in the name of the Lord And rely upon his God" (Isaiah 50:10 NKJV).

Every Christian who has set his heart on serving God will have this darkness come at some point. Has it happened to you? You wake up one day to find all spiritual feelings gone. You read your Bible and you understand the words but there is no light. You search your heart and find nothing to match what you are going through. So you pray. You get on your knees and tell God you don't feel so good. Prayer usually "changes things," it is said, but this time there seems to be no light from heaven! And you ask yourself, "What in the world have I done?"



I'm writing to you, my fellow truckers, to share my story, to share my hurt and pain in the hope that just one person is touched and doesn't make the mistakes I made. You see, I was out there driving cross country, enjoying ·my freedom just like many of you—nobody looking over my shoulder or telling me what to do. As long as my loads where delivered on time, I was free. There's only one thing wrong with that statement: I had a problem that was eating at my soul. I was addicted to pornography.

It started out small, as most addictions do: a movie here, a magazine there, no big deal. Before long I could just about tell you where every adult bookstore was on the routes I traveled. If I could not find a store, I had my computer. My life was out of control, and I couldn't even see it. The addiction got so bad that subject matter didn't matter anymore. I'd spend hours surfing the net and hundreds in the bookstores. I was also doing everything to hide my addiction from my wife and family, and it worked for the longest time. Yes, we had our problems, but nothing related to my addiction. Looking back, I'm sure my wife knew, but chose to suffer in silence. After years of hiding and doing all I could in my own power, I finally came to the point I could no longer outrun my addiction. I won't go into details because I don't want to give Satan any glory, and I also wish to protect the people I care most about. Suffice it to say that things didn't go well for me. I currently sit in an 8'x12' prison cell, paying the price for my actions. But, praise be to Jesus Christ, in this prison I've found true freedom, the freedom only Christ can and does provide.

My fellow drivers, my prayer is that through my testimony lives may be changed. I know it's not easy out there; the hours spent alone can be Satan's playground. My advice to all is: Stay connected! Find somebody who will hold you accountable, and be honest—honest with yourself and with God. You are never alone out there. It took me landing in prison to figure that out. It took me losing my freedom to find it in Christ.

So my brothers, no matter your addiction, no matter how bad (or good) your life may look right now, it can be better. I had to learn my lesson the hard way. My prayer is that, through my story, you'll find true freedom in the love that Jesus Christ offers before it's too late.

Weary of Winter?

It's still dark when we get up, and the landscape we drive through is brown and barren. I remember vividly a drive south from western New York one cloudy, gray March day. The horizon was painted with the black sillouettes of seemingly lifeless tree trunks and skinny, bare branches. Was it really possible that these deadlooking limbs would bloom anew into life when spring arrived?

As I continued my route south, I began to notice that some of the slender branches were gaining a bumpy texture. Soon I noticed branches that were covered in tiny brown buds; then further south still, a touch of green was breaking through the ends of the buds.

After a rest stop, the next section of my journey afforded views of trees with tender, young leaves. Suddenly the bare landscape was becoming alive with fresh new life as the panorama turned from brown to pale green! That caused me to think about my own life: how I once had been "dead" spiritually. My life was a winter landscape with no hope that spring would ever come.

Then someone planted a tiny seed, a simple message of hope about how God loved me; and without my even realizing it, that seed sprouted and began to grow. My eyes were opened to my need for God, as I understood that only He could save me from my sins and give me new life.

I picked up a Bible and began hungrily searching God's Word, desiring a peace that only He could provide and forgiveness for all the wrongs I'd committed in my life. "When anyone is guilty in any of these ways, he must confess in what way he has sinned" (Leviticus 5:5). What happens when we confess our sin to God? 1 John 1:9 gives us this promise: "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness."

When the Lord forgives us for our sins, He fills us with a newness of life so that we bloom with peace and joy, just as the trees in spring break forth with beautiful new life. "Faithfulness springs forth from the earth, and right-eousness looks down from heaven. The Lord will indeed give what is good, and our land will yield its harvest" (Psalm 85:11-12).

Easier said than done? Stop by a TFC chapel (listed on page 15) or call a chaplain for more guidance.



The 2018 East Coast Marmon Show



thought I would share a few memories from the Marmon show this past September at Weaver's Store in Adamstown, Pennsylvania.

After many years, I was finally able to catch up with an old family friend, Stan Horst, who married into the Weaver's Store family. Stan has been driving the Weaver's Store 1990 Marmon since it was new, in the early '90s, and, as the photo clearly shows, it still looks like the show truck it was back then!

Josh and Jenn Martin were there with their very nice 1972 Marmon. This truck was bought new by Josh's grandpa Jim. I'm sure his grandpa is delighted to have this truck remain in the family if only as a show truck.

Bill Muckel, from Bernville, Pennsylvania,

brought his grandson along in his 1986 Marmon that has also been in the family a long time—it was his father's truck. He still uses this truck as he runs forty-seven states; it's powered by an N-14 Cummins engine.


I was excited to see the rare 1951 Duplex tractor that was featured in the August and September issues of this magazine, and was able to meet its owner, Mike Ploch, from Oxford, Connecticut. From him I learned even more about this fascinating truck.





Mike found the truck at an army base while trucking through Alamos, New Mexico. It took him seven years to do the restoration! He got the cab from a fire engine and the frame from a Freightliner, and put in a 3406 Cat engine. He also changed the hood from a tilt to a butterfly. Another fascinating thing about the Duplex is that, like many cars and trucks from the '20s and '30s, the windshield opens out from the bottom for ventilation. These trucks were built in Michigan from 1916 to 1955; most were special-built for private and government agencies. Mike hauls mostly cattle; he has farms in Oklahoma and Connecticut and owns a fleet of about thirty-four trucks.

But God...

Sometimes in our walk with the Lord we may come to a point where we feel we know exactly how things will go—but God, we find out, has a different idea.

When we moved from Edmonton to Thunder Bay in July of 2014, I remember it was a very clear call from God to go and lead the ministry in Pass Lake. Many people asked how long we'd be there and my answer always was "We're here until God calls us elsewhere"—thinking that "until" was a very long time away. But God... But I'm jumping ahead of myself—I'd better backtrack a bit.

Sometime in 2017

It all really started with God answering our prayers when He brought two very capable men to join our ministry team as volunteers: Ken McGratten and Shawn Merrifield. We had no idea God was preparing the way for Canadian Ministries Director Dennis Finnamore's request a few weeks later: would we consider moving to Calgary to restart the ministry there? Our answer was a definite "no"—we were happy in Pass Lake and things were moving in the right direction as far as the ministry was concerned.

February 2018

Dennis phoned again in early February of last year and we talked, among other things, about the desperate need for a chaplain in Calgary—and he asked again. The seed that had been planted weeks before started to grow, but I still said no.



Soon after I got off the phone with Dennis, Pastor Heinz Janzen, who took over the ministry in Edmonton after we left, called; we talked about the ministry there, and also about the need in Calgary. When I mentioned Dennis' request, Pastor Heinz made some very valid points that sounded like coming straight from God. After we hung up, I called a pastor friend of mine, Jim Paulson, to talk it over with him, and he confirmed my fears—he believed God was calling us to Calgary.

Then I talked to another friend, Charlie Wilson, who asked me anybody had auoted Scripture to me that gave me peace about the move. (No one had.) After we'd finished talking, Shawn Merrifield came in, saying he'd been thinking and felt that he and Ken could handle Pass Lake if I wanted to move to Calgary (we had been praying for the Calgary chapel at our prayer breakfast for some time). He added that maybe God had brought Janet and me to start the ministry in Pass Lake and get it running so he and Ken could run it and we could move on to another. Now Shawn had no idea what

was going through my mind at the time nor did he know the peace he'd just given me. Still it kept ringing through my mind that no Scripture had been mentioned to me that would encourage me.

I called Ken and we met the next morning to talk. We had a great conversation about what may happen, then he quoted two Scripture verses to me: "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not harm you, plans to give you hope and a future" (Jeremiah 29:11*); and "So do not fear, for I am





with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand" (Isaiah 41:10). These two passages gave me the encouragement and peace I needed.

Janet and I prayed about it and then decided to move forward with the first decision: to sell our condo. We called a realtor we knew. Joanne Smith, and asked her to come over and give us an appraisal. She said the condo showed well except that the bathroom floor needed new tiles. A few days later I ran into Dennis Sargent, a man I'd met at a Christian Businessmen's Luncheon. Dennis does renovations, and he and his brother-in-law came and replaced the tiles and did a superb job. We also had to downsize quite a bit, as we had collected quite a bit of "stuff" because we thought we would be in Pass Lake for the long haul.

February is always a busy month in the Ministry, with TFC participating in Mission Fests in Winnipeg and Edmonton. As Janet and I were going to help run the TFC booth at both events, we decided it was a good time to go to Calgary and check out living accommodations there. Meanwhile, we listed the condo with the realtor before heading to Edmonton.

About a week before our trip, we attended a prayer meeting at Lakehead Baptist Church and a brother there, Garth, quoted two more scriptures for us: "Therefore, I urge you brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer yourselves as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God this is your spiritual act of worship. Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve

what God's will is—His good pleasing and perfect will" (Romans 12:1-2).

We knew the move would be hard on us financially, as well as physically (we're no longer so young), but we also knew the Lord would provide for our needs; besides, not obeying was *not* an option!

May 2018

By mid-May the condo hadn't sold yet, but we had showings and believed it was just a matter of time—God's time! Meanwhile we were working toward the goal of moving to Calgary, including setting up a meeting of Dennis with our volunteers and finding a replacement for Janet, who keeps the books at the truck stop. Carol, one of the owners, was very concerned about this as it was hard to get people to come out to Pass Lake to work. Once more, God answered: Dennis was very happy with

the two men who will keep the ministry going in Pass Lake. Now it was a matter of finding a replacement for Janet and waiting for the condo to sell.

October 2018

We were in Pennsylvania to attend the TFC staff conference and were on our way home when we got the news that the truck stop had been sold, relieving the need to hire a replacement for Janet; and received a text from the realtor telling us she had a showing and a reasonable offer. I won't go through all the details; suffice to say we took a bit of a loss on the sale. We accepted the offer with one month to move out and we still had no place to go. On October 27th Janet and I flew to Calgary and met with Craig Rushton to see some condos he had lined up for us. With the beating we took in Thunder Bay's sale, we couldn't really afford to purchase a condo there, so after much prayer we decided to look at rentals. We found a beautiful place in the west end with a wonderful view of the mountains. After working out some financials, we signed a lease.

January 2019

The mover picked up our belongings on November 29 and we left for Calgary, arriving on December 1st. We are still busy getting settled and cleaning up the chapel and getting it set up to reopen. The ministry here in Calgary is in desperate need financially, so we will be very busy as well arranging speaking engagements, holding a banquet, and praying for God's provision for the needs of the ministry.

To sum it up, we are starting to feel at home here. I really thought it would take a very long time for us to feel this way—but God, once again, surprised us!

Forgiveness Is a Gift You Give to Yourself

orgiveness is one of the most powerful and most taught concepts in the Bible; it's also the least understood and most underused. Once you realize the power that forgiveness unleashes, you will want to forgive, say, seventy times seven, even though it seems impossible at times to forgive just one time. I'm serious!

Jesus gives us all a startling warning about not forgiving others: if we refuse to forgive others, God will also refuse to forgive us. Now, we know God does forgive

us even though there is no way we can perfectly and totally forgive all those who have transgressed against us. But think about it—how long are you willing to go without the forgiveness of God? Great sinners are transformed into exceptional Christians now and eternally because of the power of forgiveness...the gift of forgiveness.

I never cease to be amazed at how diabolically deceitful Satan is. You see, our pride is wounded when we are hurt. We feel pain from recent wounds as well as past ones. We blame others for our pain. We need our perpetrator to experience hurt and pain to even up the score. We think that we will be "healed" when our attacker experiences pain. Unknowingly, we give that other person ongoing control and power over us.

Forgiveness is a gift you give to others; but it is more than just that. When you forgive, you give a powerful and liberating gift to yourself. Free yourself from abuse and bondage. Allow God to soothe and heal your pain and teach you to grow the mind of Christ. We are also now realizing the powerful physical, emotional, and psychological benefits of forgiveness even in the dire areas of addictions and cancer!

Jesus modeled forgiveness perfectly for us. Think of all those whom Jesus forgave: the woman caught in adultery, Peter who denied he knew Jesus, the criminal on the cross—even those who crucified Him. Offering forgiveness brings joy and peace; withholding forgiveness brings bitterness, victimization, and the need to see the offender suffer.

Today, don't let your pride get in the way of forgiving others. If you are withholding forgiveness, you are missing a wonderful opportunity to experience joy and spread it to others. Forgiving others is very pleasing to God. Whether you submit to God and forgive others or you fester in bitterness and revenge is entirely your decision, so choose well.

Prayer

Dear Father, thanks be to You, Lord, for Your incredible gift of forgiveness. Without it I would be buried under a ton of sin and shame. I am so quick to

ask for Your forgiveness, Lord, but so slow to forgive others. Help me remember that forgiving others lifts a heavy burden off me and places me back under the grace of Your forgiveness. I thank You, Lord, for the many examples of forgiveness demonstrated by Your Son, Jesus. I seek to forgive as Jesus forgave. I seek the mind of Christ. Lord, help me spread Your message about forgiveness. I pray this through Jesus Christ who paid the ultimate price so that my sins may be forgiven. Amen.

The Truth

For if you forgive men when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive men their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins (Matthew 6:14-15).

And when you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive him, so that your Father in heaven may forgive you your sins (Mark 11:25).

Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you (Ephesians 4:32).

It's Not All About You!

To the last number of years, Pearl and I have chosen a different devotional each year to prepare us for our day. Beginning our day together in this way has challenged, corrected, and built us up in our faith, seeking to be what He has called us to be that day. For 2019 we have chosen to use Oswald Chambers' My Utmost for His Highest.

The copy we are using was given to me by a friend years back, and it's formatted with extra space so you can journal. I am writing this on January 25, and on today's devotional Oswald Chambers encourages us to "leave room for God." Referring to words of the Apostle Paul in Galatians 1:15, he highlights the words "But when it pleased God..." I quote his words: "As workers for God we have to learn to make room for God—to give God 'elbow room.' We calculate and estimate, and say that this and that will happen, and we forget to make room for God to come in as He chooses. Would we be surprised if God came into our meeting or into our preaching in a way we had never looked for Him to come? Do not look for God to come in any particular way, but *look for Him.*"

Take a look at Galatians 1:15-16 from two different translations: "But when it pleased God, who separated me from my mother's womb, and called me by his grace, to reveal his Son in me, that I might preach him among the heathen..." (KJV); and "But when God, who had set me apart even from my mother's womb and called me through His grace, was pleased to reveal His Son in me so that I might preach Him among the Gentiles..." (NASB).

I share with you what I wrote in response that day: We believe God is a God of order. But does that mean if a form is good and excellent and successful, that we repeat and maintain that same process and expect the same outcome? To what point do we maintain the same procedures even when things are not working as they did before? So often we say we're going to make it work even if it kills us. At that point, have we lost or ignored God's direction? It is that constant presence (relationship) we

have with God that allows us to hear, see, and discern when things are not what we had planned. Oh God, help me!

How often do we consider God in our plans? Is it only after everything we have done and tried is not working? Is it only at that point that we ask God for His input?

Today's materialistic culture has left so little room for God. We can purchase untold number of books and attend countless number of seminars whose speakers tell us ways to be successful in life. Being successful in anything we do in life is best accomplished when we "plan our work and work our plan" as is stressed by so many of today's leaders and successful people.

But is God pleased in our decision-making process? How much is He in our thoughts and plans and conversations each day? Today's "all about me" culture leaves little room for us to hear God speak. Results are so different when it's "all about me." It is quite obvious that when everything is all about us, there is a limited possibility that God is included. But when it pleases God, He will break through all of that. There are countless examples in both biblical history and in modern time. As stated in Galatians 1:15-16, Paul recognized that it was God's pleasure that brought him (Paul) into this world for the preaching to the Gentiles. You could also say it pleased God to bring a storm and shipwreck to change the direction Paul had planned to go. I don't know about you, but I have seen that in my life. Did I recognize it as such or did I fret and become discouraged? I need to always remind myself that it's not all about me. It's all about God!

reen Onion and his friend and teammate, Hog Caller, were rolling down 95, going 95, when a Smokey Bear pulled them over for speeding. Green Onion was making all kinds of excuses—the urgency of the run, his dispatcher's insistence to get this perishable load to its destination lest it spoil, and so on. The officer told Green Onion he would let him go with a warning ticket. Being overly tired and in a jovial mood, Hog Caller said to Smokey Bear, "Why don't you give Green Onion season tickets? His hobby is collecting warning tickets from every state of the Union." There was very little talking in the cab the rest of the run!

I wonder how many of us are collecting "warning tickets" from the Holy Spirit! He came to convict us of the sin of not believing in Jesus Christ, the only true God and Messiah. He did not come to condemn us, but to help us believe and to give us true joy and the peace of knowing our sins are forgiven when we trust Him.

And we all need forgiveness. "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God," the Bible says in Romans 3:23 and then goes on to say, in 6:23, "For the wages of sin is death" (eternal separation from God). The warning ticket is, "It is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment, so Christ was offered once to bear the sins of many. To those who eagerly wait for Him He will appear a second time, apart from sin, for salvation" (Hebrews 9:27-28 NKJV). It is God's will to use us as His servants to warn the world that God is not willing to see any perish, but all come to repentance. We tell and preach by our life and lips that "God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved" (John 3:17 NKJV). The Apostle Paul said to the Colossians, "God willed to make known what are the riches of the glory of this mystery... which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. Him we preach, warning every man and teaching every man in all wisdom, that we may present every man perfect in Christ Jesus" (Colossians 1:27-28 NKJV).

Jesus gave us another warning: "Then if anyone says to you, 'Look, here is the Christ!' or 'There!' do not believe it. For false christs and false prophets will rise and show great signs and wonders to deceive" (Matthew 24:23 NKJV). Satan's counterfeits say Jesus was just a man, an angel, a prophet, an example, a myth, or just a good moral teacher to follow.

But He is our Savior who "humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross. Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth, and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Philippians 2:9-11 NKJV). We are warned that "Nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12 NKJV).

But we also have this wonderful promise: "If you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation" (Romans 10:9-10 NKJV). We believe that salvation is by faith in Jesus Christ alone, not in a religionist organized system, personal convictions, ideas, theology, astrology or philosophy, but in Jesus. "Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, to God who alone is wise, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen" (I Timothy 1:17 NKJV).

Do You Know Your ABCs?

If you were to die today, where would you spend eternity? You can know for sure.
