
A trucker walked into the chapel and told me, "Chaplain Don, I won't be attending your chapel anymore, or any other chapel for that matter!"

"May I ask why?" I said.

The trucker replied, "I see people on their cell phones, texting and typing during the service. Some are gossiping, some just aren't living right, some I know are sleeping around—they're all hypocrites."

I stood there for a moment, then asked him, "Would you do me a favor before making your decision final?"

He replied, "Sure, what is it?"



He agreed, took the glass, walked twice around the outside of the chapel, and came back in, proudly announcing, "Okay, it's done; and I didn't let a single drop spill!"

I took the glass from him and then asked him these questions: "Did you see anyone on their phone? Did you see anyone gossiping? Was anyone acting in a sinful way?"

He said, "I didn't notice any of that because I was focused on the glass, to make sure no water would spill out."

I told him, "When you come to this chapel, or any other chapel, or a church, you should be just as focused on Jesus as you were focused on this glass of water. Jesus called us to follow Him, not to follow other Christians. Don't let your relationship with God be determined by how others act. Let it be determined by how focused you, yourself, are on God!"

No Greater Love

Valentine's Day. Time to think of love and friendship. Time to express affection and appreciation to those around us. However, for many, the day may be only a reminder of disappointment, loss, or betrayal. A reminder of love or friendship gone wrong.

Could it be because we so often put a burden on those we love, expecting them to supply all our emotional needs? Let's face it, even the best relationships are open to disappointment, because no human relationship can truly satisfy the need of the human heart, no matter how close and how deep the relationship may be. Why?

Because the human heart was made for God. Only His love can fulfill it. It was St. Augustine who said, "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they find rest in You." He's also the one who said, "God loves each one of us as if there were only one of us." And His love is not dependent on our performance or ability to love Him back. As author Philip Yancey wrote, "Grace teaches us that God loves because of Who God is, not because of who we are."

He has shown for you and me the greatest form of love: "Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13); or, in the familiar words of John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" (NKJV). And in Jeremiah 31:3 He tells us, "I have loved you with an everlasting love; therefore with lovingkindness I have drawn you" (NKJV).

Open Your Heart to His Love Today—He Is Waiting for You


- ☑ Believe in Jesus for the forgiveness of your sins and for eternal life.





More True Stories of God's Amazing Grace



Is Stress Getting the Best of You?

verywhere you look these days, there is stress. Life has guaranteed it. Or should I say, sin has guaranteed it. Jesus told his disciples in John 16:33, "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." Jesus delivered these words of encouragement after He had informed the disciples of the threats they would experience due to the message they would be proclaiming about Him after he was gone. Talk about stress!

Is stress overcoming you? Have you given up on life? Stress is most often caused by poor choices and decisions that result in poor health, poor relationships, and unstable futures. If that is so, is it possible we create our own stress? Or is it merely the way we respond to our stress?

Let's talk about relationships. We fail to connect the dots. We partner with people every day; people we do not even know. We partner with people on the highway or in the checkout line. We choose to ignore someone cutting us off in traffic instead of letting him know what we think. Or we may invite an individual with fewer items to go ahead of us at the checkout counter. Often we do better partnering with these strangers than with those closest to us. Are we more gracious to a stranger than those closest to us? Partnering means being considerate, forgiving, and helpful for the expediency of a relationship.

Stress can come from either a great love or hate for someone. When does love turn to hate and more often indifference? Maybe you are stressed over the realization that the communication of your deepest feelings did not meet with understanding. Or it is the nagging question, "Is the other person living a lie simply for their advantage?"

Taking a relationship for granted can also be stressful. It is assumed that no matter what I do or say, the other person will always love me. It is that need we are born with—to love and be loved. It is inherent in all of us. But

the sin of self wars against the fulfilment of this deepest need.

When two people live to satisfy and bless the other, a bond is established and, if maintained, can become the human picture of God's love and commitment to them. Thus, the marriage of a man and woman living in a lifelong commitment is the foundation for a life better capable of handling the stress that is sure to come. But the foundation begins with the relationship one has with Jesus Christ. It begins by acknowledging the sin nature within us that constantly wants to please self. It is the decision to confess sin, repent, and believe the sacrifice of Jesus' death on the cross frees us from the penalty of being eternally separated from God.

Jesus overcomes the stress in our lives when we realize the need to yield our lives to Him and live according to His will. That is when we live by the power of His Holy Spirit. Without that power we are powerless to battle the sin nature that is always looking out for #1. When you squeeze an orange, you expect orange juice. The Apostle Paul tells us that when a believer in Jesus Christ is squeezed, the result should be "love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit" (Galatians 5:22-25).

When life squeezes you, do people see Jesus?

Lost and Found

ey, Green Onion! I found them!" shouted Hog Caller, excitedly. "What did you find, Hog?" "My lost teeth! Would you believe they were still in the truck stop restroom after two days?" "Yes, I do, Hog — who would even touch some old yellow dentures, let alone steal them? But don't worry, if you hadn't found them, I would have let you use mine after I had finished eating my lunch."

Lost treasures are at the heart of many great stories. There's a story of a king who found the greatest treasure that has ever been lost. The story is in the Bible, and the treasure was God's Word. It was discovered by Hilkiah, the high priest of Judah during the days of King Josiah. During the restoration of the temple, some workers found the book (or rather, the scroll) and took it to the high priest, who told the king, "I have found the book of the law in the house of the Lord" (2 Kings 22:8). When King Josiah "heard the words of the book of the law" (verse 11) and realized how far the nation had strayed from God, his reaction was true repentance, which brought revival to the nation of Judah.

Throughout the ages, God, in His grace, providentially preserved His inspired Holy Word. The Holy Spirit of God guided all the writers to record all that He wanted us to know until we see Him, the Author and Finisher of our faith, face to face.

God's Holy Book tells us of the greatest, most awesome gift He has ever given to us, His one and only Son, Jesus Christ, who died on the cross of Calvary to pay for the penalty of our sins. After spending an incredible day with Jesus, Andrew, who would become one of Christ's disciples, found his brother, Simon Peter, and told him, "We have found the Messiah' (that is, the Christ). And he brought him to Jesus" (John 1:40-42). And another disci-

ple, Philip, said to his friend Nathaniel, "We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law, and about whom the prophets also wrote—Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph" (John 1:45).

Have you found Him? Do you know Jesus Christ in a personal way? John wrote that his purpose for writing his Gospel was "that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name" (John 20:31). The Bible says that all who have not been born again, all who have not personally repented of their sins, are lost. Jesus the Good Shepherd is searching for them like the man who left ninety-nine of his sheep safely in their pen and went out to find the one that was lost; when he found it, he carried it home rejoicing. In the same way Jesus says there will be rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents (Luke 15:7).

Repentance means turning from your sins and believing that Jesus Christ is the only way, truth, and life and that He alone can save you. "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12).

When Jesus came into this world, He took the humble position of a servant. God appeared in human form. His eternal purpose was to provide salvation through His death on the cross for us lost, sinful rebels. "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

The Bible says that "we all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way" (Isaiah 53:6). We are all lost! But we are found when we receive Him. If you are lost, you can be found! And if you are found, seek to help the Lord, the Good Shepherd, find others so there will be great rejoicing in heaven.
